

## RULES

1. Exhibitors are restricted to no more than 15 exhibits in the Flower Section and Vegetable & Fruit Section.
2. Exhibitors are allowed only one entry per class.
3. All flowers and vegetables exhibited must be freshly picked and have been in the possession of the Exhibitor at least two calendar months prior to the date of the Show, and the Committee reserves the right to inspect the gardens to verify the exhibits with the exception of Classes 45 – 52.
4. All objections must be made to the Secretary. The objector to lodge 50p, which will be returned on the objection being proved.
5. The Hall will be open at 8.30am. Exhibits must be staged by 10.45am and not removed until after the raffle.
6. Prize money will be paid out between 3.30 and 4.30pm. Presentation of cups approximately 4.00pm followed by the raffle.
7. All Cups and Trophies are Perpetual, and will be held by the winner for one year only, to be returned to the Secretary before next year's Flower Show. The Committee will arrange and pay for any engraving of winners' names – as appropriate.
8. The Committee will not be responsible for any article lost/damaged on the show day.

The Committee wishes to thank all the donors of the Cups and Awards, Mary Smith for collecting Entry Forms and Fees; and everyone who supports the show.

### Class 61 - Recipe

1 small cooking apple, peeled, cored and chopped	110g soft margarine
175g soft brown sugar	2 eggs, lightly beaten
110g wholemeal flour	110g plain flour
A pinch of salt	1 1/2 tsps baking powder
110g walnuts, chopped	75g dates, chopped
3-4 tbsps milk	

Whisk together margarine, sugar, eggs, flours, salt and baking powder.  
Add apple, then walnuts and dates. Mix. Finally add the milk. Mix all together.  
Put into a lined 2lb loaf tin. Bake at 180C for 1 hour or until a skewer inserted in the middle comes out clean. Let the cake cool for two minutes in the tin then turn out onto a wire cooling rack.
